A stunning and extremely high quality pair of French mid 18th century oil on canvas paintings in their original frames by Claude-Joseph Vernet. Each wonderfully executed painting is set within a most decorative mottled giltwood frame with beautiful richly carved scrolled foliate designs and fine palmettes at each corner. The painting to the left, entitled "La Cascade", depicts a charming clearing in the forest and a rock formation with a tree growing above and a waterfall flowing out. At the center are charming personages draped in period attire standing in front of a large boulder from where a tree grows. The painting to the right, entitled "Mer Houleuse", depicts a sailboat in tumultuous weather with waves crashing against the cliff where sailors are trying to pull their boat ashore. Wonderful attention to detail throughout.

(Claude) Joseph Vernet - Born in Avignon, Aug. 14, 1712 and died in Paris, Dec. 23, 1789. French school, he was a marine painter and son and pupil of Antoine Vernet and pupil of Adrien Manglard. He went to Rome in 1732 and studied under many great artist. He became the first marine painter in Europe and was commissioned by the King to paint all the seaports of France of which he completed fifteen of the twenty.
